

Tea for Inner Peace

SHOFU AN is a tea house located in Manazuru. Manazuru is designated as a scenic area and has a "standard of beauty" that defines the beauty of the town. This standard was established to ensure that the residents of Manazuru live in harmony with nature by considering the lifestyle of residents as "beauty.

This sense of beauty is similar to the wabi-cha of Sen no Rikyu, who once used fishermen's fish baskets as flower vases.

The name Matsukaze, from which the SHOFU AN hermitage takes its name, means a wind blowing through the treetops of pine trees, resembling the sound of tea being boiled.
